Forest Regeneration	In year 2018, a total of 25 PSP has been established.	The PSP data set was analyzed using Methods of Yield Regulation with Limited Information (MYRLIN) (<i>Alder et al., 2002</i>). Regeneration assumption: a) Recruitment based on 20 trees per year for Dipterocarp species and 8 trees per year for non-Dipterocarp species b) Mortality rate of 1%
Condition of the forest	The analyzed data to date has been derived from the first assessment of 25 PSP (see Forest Regeneration for details).	Analysis from the first assessment of 25 PSP ➤ The non-Dipterocarp species had higher stocking of 68% compared to 32% of Dipterocarp species for trees in the lower or upper diameter classes. Within 1-hectare plot, there are 302 of Dipterocarps and 577 non-Dipterocarps saplings on average. Continuous good practice of RIL is important to sustain timber resource into the future. The re-assessment of growth will be carried out in 2021.
